BILL SUMMARY

House Bill 22 (HB 22) proposes changes to administrator preparation programs at higher education institutions in New Mexico, including the state-level oversight structure which will move out of higher education department (HED) into the public education department (PED) within a new School Leadership Institute; preferential movement toward a year-long residency model; program requirements toward state and national standards, provisional and alternative principal licensure systems, and an FY25 appropriation of \$2,000.00 (two million dollars) to carry out purposes of the Act.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

A primary component of HB 22 would move clinical experience requirements of principal preparation programs to a year-long paid residency placement. The Bill is not clear as to how these year-long paid residencies would be funded.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

It is not clear who or what entities will be funding the year-long paid residencies. Resources would need to be put in place to ensure school districts are able to release principal candidates from their teaching positions in order for them to participate in the residency placement, and would need to also account for compensation for the mentoring principal, and other program stakeholders, along with the cost for substitute teachers and other district personnel which would be needed to ensure the residencies run well.
