Based on our current numbers and the estimated cost of a year-long residency, we would need approximately \$1.8 million annually to pay for these.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

It is difficult, at best, to estimate the financial impact of this bill. We offer an Educational Leadership program that exemplifies a commitment to effective leader preparation. The Master of Education (M.Ed.) program comprises 36 credit hours, and the Licensure program consists of 24 credit hours. These were designed to align with national and state standards through a coherent curriculum. Our program also offers robust clinical experiences, featuring a full-academic-year internship, which provides prospective educational leaders with immersive and hands-on learning opportunities. The extensive school experience of licensed professionals fosters collaborative learning and professional development among participants. Furthermore, we also establish formal partnerships with local school districts, enabling a strong connection between the university and the educational institution where candidates will eventually serve.

However, the bill lacks specificity in how programs will be evaluated and approved. Without standards

and criteria, it is impossible to judge the resources needed to refine/develop the curriculum, partnerships, etc., that will be required to meet the intent of this bill. It is also not indicated who will bear the cost of providing "Paid" residencies this bill requires.
