BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Relating to executive reorganization; creating a task force to study the feasibility of creating a Department of African American Affairs.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There is no fiscal impact to the Office of African America Affairs. One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) will be appropriated from the general fund and to allocate the Health Care Authority Department for expenditures in fiscal years 2024 and 2025 to support the task force to determine the feasibility of creating a Department of African American Affairs. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2025 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The operational mandate of OAAA within HB38 requires the Executive Director or designee to participate on the task force. This requirement would place additional duties on the current Acting Executive Director as there is no available alternative executive or management designee. The Office of African American Affairs is awaiting the governor's office decision to appoint a new Executive Director.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

On January 6, 2024, the sponsor of this legislation helded a community leaders zoom meeting to discuss her plan to introduce legislation to create a Task Force to study the creation of the Department of African Affairs. Between 70-80 community leaders from around New Mexico participated in the zoom meeting. The consensus from the New Mexico community leaders was that they were not in support of the pending legislation. The New Mexico Community Leaders expressed that the funding would be best spent shoring up the current agencies and its

infrastructure. In addition, the State Office African American Affairs agrees with the New Mexico Community Leaders. The three agencies, MLK, AAPAC and OAAA would be best served by shoring up their infrastructure and outreach capacity.
