This analysis is neither a formal Opinion nor an Advisory Letter issued by the New Mexico Department of Justice. This is a staff analysis in response to a committee or legislator's request. The analysis does not represent any official policy or legal position of the NM Department of Justice.

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

HB 43 proposes a requirement for New Mexico State Police (NMSP) to purchase and loan out equipment designed to engrave vehicle identification number of a motor vehicles onto New Mexico residents' catalytic converters. The bill also proposes an annual appropriation of \$400,000 to NMSP to purchase the equipment. In addition to purchasing the equipment, NMSP would be required to enter into agreements to loan out this equipment to law enforcement agencies and motor vehicle repair or service shops. The organizations receiving the equipment lent by NMSP would be required to engrave numbers onto catalytic converters for New Mexico residents at no cost.

HB 43 also proposes parameters when NMSP loans the engraving equipment. These parameters include that only one tool shall be lent to each organization, the organizations shall receive and possess each tool for a maximum renewable term of twenty-four months, and that NMSP retains ownership of the tools throughout the lending process. HB 43 further specifies that NMSP may create any other loaning requirement or condition deemed necessary.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The bill also proposes an annual appropriation of \$400,000 to NMSP to purchase the equipment.
