## **SECTION III: NARRATIVE**

#### **BILL SUMMARY**

Synopsis: House Bill 61 proposes to make the crime of committing aggravated battery on a police officer a second-degree felony when 1) inflicting great bodily harm; 2) doing so with a deadly weapon; or 3) doing so in any manner whereby great bodily harm or death can be inflicted.

Currently this crime is a third-degree felony. Changing the degree of the felony from third to second degree increases the statute of limitations for prosecution from five to six years, increases the basic sentence from three to nine years, and the potential fine from \$5,000 to \$10,000.

Effective date is July 1, 2024.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The department's financial implications would rely on the outcomes of prosecutions and convictions, potentially leading to a rise in individuals convicted of felonies. Increasing the degree from a third to a second degree felony would increase the basic sentence from three to nine years which would triple the amount to house the inmate. The average cost per inmate for the department, based on calculations from FY23 expenditures, is around \$57,103 a year or roughly \$156 per day. In comparison, the average cost to oversee an individual on community supervision is approximately \$6,108. The overall cost increase to the department as a result of this legislation is expected to be minimal.
