BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

The Cannabis Regulation Act, as signed into law on April 12, 2021 and codified under Sections 26-2C-1 to 26-2C-42 NMSA 1978, removed cannabis as a controlled substance under the Controlled Substances Act, Chapter 30, Article 31 NMSA 1978, which legalized the cultivation, manufacturing, consumption, possession and purchasing of recreational cannabis for adults 21 years and older. Under the Delinquency Act, a juvenile is referred for services through Juvenile Probation when they are found to have violated the Controlled Substances Act. As a result of the 2021 Cannabis Regulation Act, a juvenile found to have been in the possession of cannabis is not referred for services but instead is required to either attend a free four-hour evidence based drug education and legal rights program or complete four hours of community service. This house bill proposes to amend the Delinquency Act to include the buying and attempting to buy, receiving, or possessing or being served any cannabis product, the producing of cannabis, or being present in a licensed retail cannabis establishment without a parent, guardian, custodian or adult spouse by a juvenile as a delinquent act subject to penalties described under the act, including a referral for Juvenile Probation services.
