BILL SUMMARY

House Bill ("HB") 85 would amend the Lobbyist Registration Act ("the Act"), NMSA 1978, Chapter 2, Art. 11. A new section of the Act would require lobbyists to file a report with the Secretary of State prior to the end of the legislative session detailing 1) the specific legislation lobbied, 2) the lobbyist's or lobbyist's employer's support, opposition, or other position on the legislation, and 3) the name of the lobbyist's employer that lobbied (either directly or through the lobbyist). The bill also contains a provision to extend the filing deadline if lobbying is conducted after the adjournment of the legislative session (extending to the deadline for the Governor to act on legislation).

HB 85 additionally amends NMSA 1978, § 2-11-7 to reflect the addition of the lobbying activity report.
