#### **BILL SUMMARY**

**Synopsis:** 

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

This bill would have a small negative fiscal impact on gross receipts revenues of municipalities. The FIR from the same bill from 2023 estimated a total impact of less than \$200 thousand to all local governments. The revenue loss amount, while small, is uncertain.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

HB 93 would erode the local gross receipts tax base of municipalities, which is contrary to the policy principles adopted by the New Mexico Municipal League.

Municipalities' means of raising revenue are fairly limited and continuously shrinking the local tax base could leave cities without the revenue necessary to fund key operations – including public safety, transportation services, senior services, parks and recreation, libraries, and many other services that residents rely on.
