## BILL SUMMARY

## Synopsis:

HB 183 amends Section 30-7-4, concerning negligent use of a deadly weapon, so that the penalty is raised from a petty misdemeanor to a misdemeanor for a first offense, and a fourth degree felony for a second or subsequent offense.

## SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

It is difficult to determine what the effect of passing HB 183 would be on the state's prison population, but the penalties included in the bill could lead to more people being incarcerated by the Corrections Department, particularly as the bill would turn certain misdemeanors into felonies. The average per day cost to incarcerate someone in the state's prison system is \$156.45/day; this average includes private and public facilities.
