(Essentially identical to 2023 HB271) Raises the threshold amount of damages to a vehicle from \$500 to \$1,000 or more to trigger the requirement for a written accident report to be submitted by the driver of the damaged vehicle to the Department of Transportation. The driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in bodily injury or death of any person or total property damage to an apparent extent of \$1,000 or more shall, within five days after the accident, forward a written report of the accident to the Department of Transportation.
