BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Bill 218 (HB218) is amending eligibility requirements by reducing the hours at a practice site from two thousand eighty to one thousand five hundred for the full credit and from one thousand forty but less than two thousand eighty for half credit to seven hundred ninety-two but less than one thousand five hundred eighty-four. HB218 is also amending the definition of "Rural" in the Rural Health Care Practitioner Tax Credit.

Current definition: "Rural" means an area or location identified by the department of health as falling outside of an urban area.

New definition: "Rural" means a rural county or an incorporated area of a partially rural county, as designated by the health resources and services administration of the United States Department of Health and Human Services.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

Reducing the hours in HB218 could help address health care workforce shortages, which would ultimately improve access to care for Medicaid-enrolled members and all New Mexicans. The reduction in hours for the tax credit may increase service utilization among Medicaid individuals as providers recruited and retained in parts of the state with limited access to care.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

Improving access to health care, especially in rural areas, is a key priority for HSD. HB218 aligns with HSD's efforts to support, increase, and expand the health care provider workforce in rural New Mexico.
