## BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: House Bill 239 prohibits cannabis in places of imprisonment; makes an exception if carried in pursuant to the direction or prescription of a health care provider. Adds cannabis, cannabis extract and cannabis product to the definition of "contraband" if carried into a prison or jail without direction or prescription of a health care provider.

Defines:

- "Cannabis" as all parts of the plant genus cannabis containing a delta-9-
tetrahydrocannabinol concentration of more than three-tenths percent on a dry weight basis, whether growing or not; its seeds; resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seed or its resin.
- "Cannabis extract" as a product obtained by separating resins, tetrahydrocannabinols or other substances from cannabis by approved extraction methods and does not include the weight of any other substance combined with the cannabis;
- "Cannabis product" as a product that is or contains cannabis or cannabis extract.


## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Under the passing of this bill, if cannabis extract or cannabis products pursuant to the direction or prescription of a health care provider were allowed within prisons and jails then it would not be considered contraband. As written this bill would have little or no fiscal impact on the department.
