# Synopsis:

House Bill 240 (HB 240) for the Military Veterans Affairs Committee, is an act that appropriates \$2,000,000 to Veterans' Services Department for use in FY2025 to contract with a veteran, police, and first responder posttraumatic stress disorder therapy program.


#### SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), roughly 1 in 3 first responders develop PTSD. In comparison, the incidence of PTSD in the general population is 1 in 5 people.

The 2014 JAMA Psychiatry study found the rate of PTSD for military veterans to be 15 times higher than civilians. https://jamanetwork.com/journals/jamapsychiatry/fullarticle/1835338

Per the Center for the Advancement of Health, 30% of first responders have mental health issues compared to 20% of the general population, and 80% of first responders describe being exposed to trauma during the course of their job duties. Between 10% and 15% of first responders have a PTSD diagnosis and 400,000 annually report symptoms of PTSD. Knowledge that PTSD symptoms they experience may be job related may increase their likelihood to seek and receive treatment.
