BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> HB 263 amends Section 14-14A-28 NMSA 1978 to increase the maximum fee that may be charged by a notarial officer for specified notarial acts, as follows:

- Increases the maximum fee per acknowledgment from \$5 to \$10;
- Increases the maximum fee per person for oaths or affirmations without a signature from \$5 to \$10;
- Increases the maximum fee per jurat from \$5 to \$10; and
- Increases the minimum total charge for copy certifications from \$5 to \$10.

The effective date of the Act is July 1, 2024.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be a minimal administrative cost for statewide update, distribution and documentation of statutory changes. New laws, amendments to existing laws and new hearings have the potential to increase caseloads in the courts, thus requiring additional resources to handle the increase.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES
