#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> The Senate Conservation amendment to Senate Bill 169 (SB 169/a) amends Page 2, lines 5 - 10 to read, "…land and water conservation fund state and local assistance formula grants program" and on Page 3, lines 5 -6, clarifies that "technical assistance" does not include the Division conducting compliance procedures on behalf of the applicants for the National Environmental Protection Act pathway (e.g., environmental clearances, archaeological cultural surveys), processing of permits, producing geographic information systems data, or conducting project planning, developing designs, engaging contracting, or directing project management.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB 169 as amended by the Senate Conservation Committee ensures that the new appropriation in the underlying bill to the State Supplemental Land and Water Conservation Fund (SSLWCF) can only be used as match by eligible entities for the Land and Water Conservation Fund State and Local Assistance Formula Grants Program (the Formula Grants). The State Parks Division of the Energy, Minerals, & Natural Resources Department (the Division) supports this amendment as it clarifies that the SSLWCF is not intended to provide match for the Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership (ORLP). The ORLP is another, separate program supported by the Land and Water Conservation Fund.

# SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

#### **PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS**

SB 169/a defines and effectively informs eligible SSLWCF eligible applicants that the Division shall not provide technical assistance to applicants to include compliance procedures on behalf of the applicants for the federal National Environmental Policy Act of 1969, which includes processing of permits, producing geographic information systems data, conducting project planning, developing designs, or engaging, contracting, or directing project management. This will ensure that applicants and the Division have clear delineation of responsibilities.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

SB 169 will better support the Division to administer SSLWCF funds in support of eligible projects during the early stages of the grant application and preliminary review process.

#### WHAT WILL BE THE CONSEQUENCES OF NOT ENACTING THIS BILL

If SB 169/a is not enacted, there will be to amendments to the SSLWCF, the political subdivision fund matching requirement will not be removed, the incorporated municipality population cap will not be removed, there will be no amendment for eligible recipients of funds, and there will be no prioritization of funding requests of Indian nations, tribes, pueblos, and rural communities. Reference to a defunct entity will not be removed, and citations will not be revised. A ten million dollars (\$10,000.0) appropriation from the General Fund to the SSLWCF for expenditure in fiscal year 2025 and subsequent fiscal years to carry out the purposes of the fund will not occur.
