#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> HM 34 requests that a working group, consisting of various state agencies, be convened, and managed by the Wild Friends Program at the University of New Mexico School of Law. The working group is tasked with developing and recommending actions to establish and expand the use of citizen science using the best available science and data collection practices, which includes a pilot project for the use of the Wild Friends Program and for use as a template for state government agencies. The working group will report its recommendations to an appropriate interim committee by October 31, 2024.

#### **FISCAL IMPLICATIONS**

The University of New Mexico and the Wild Friends Program do not foresee any fiscal impact with convening and managing the state agency working group. Wild Friends already has great educational programming and is well staffed to take on the work of managing this working group.

The Wild Friends Program is a civics and science education program at the UNM School of Law, working with students in grades 4-12 across New Mexico. Each year the students vote on a wildlife conservation topic, research the topic, and help draft legislation to address the needs identified. The students then travel to the NM State Legislature during the legislative session to advocate for the legislation. In 2024, the students helped to draft this memorial, which asks for a working group amongst NM Dept. of Game and Fish, NM Division of State Parks, and the State Land Office to explore the expanded use of citizen science by state agencies.

### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The University of New Mexico and the Wild Friends Program do not foresee any significant issues with convening and managing the state agency working group.
