#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> House Memorial 42 (HM 42) asks the Department of the Environment (NMED) to convene "a working group of state experts and stakeholders to develop proposals for rules and legislative recommendations that aim to reduce methane emissions relating to the production, transportation, and marketing of natural gas purchased by New Mexico's regulated utilities."

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None specifically for EMNRD. It is possible that EMNRD senior staff and regulatory experts would need to devote some staff time to participation in the working group.

#### **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

HM 42 proposes to have NMED convene a working group to study methane emissions from natural gas-providing regulated utilities. This is an important area of emissions control to investigate, as methane emissions from the gas distribution system contribute to both human health concerns and global anthropogenic climate change.

EMNRD suggests that the memorial explicitly include the Pipeline Safety Bureau of the Public Regulation Commission as well as EMNRD as a whole (in its role as the State Energy Office and as the regulatory expert – though not the regulator – in utilities for the state) in the entities which must participate in the working group, as these are the likely 'state experts' that the memorial refers to.
