BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

The bill appropriates \$9.0 million from the General Fund to the Regents of New Mexico State University for expenditure in fiscal years 2025 through 2027 for the New Mexico Department of Agriculture to implement its existing livestock Mexican wolf compensation program contract with the County Livestock Loss Authority established by Catron county, Sierra county and Socorro county. The funds would be used to supplement an existing Federal compensation program for impacts to livestock of the Federally endangered Mexican gray wolf. State funds would only be used upon the exhaustion of the Federal funds.

Compensation would be paid for confirmed and probable losses including both direct and indirect losses. Loss determinations would be made by the U.S. Department of Agriculture's Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service Wildlife Services Investigator, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service Field Team, or a County or Tribal Investigator qualified in wildlife predator investigations. Compensation would be at fair market value as determined quarterly by New Mexico State University. The fair market value determination shall be published on a separate page of the New Mexico Department of Agriculture's publicly accessible web page. Files related to the program shall be held by either the County Livestock Loss Authority or the New Mexico Department of Agriculture and made publicly available.

Any unexpended or unencumbered balance at the end of fiscal year 2027 shall revert to the General Fund
