BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 37 committee substitute will create a State Meat Inspection program which will be overseen by the Livestock Board. The Livestock Board is tasked with creating the program, in compliance with federal law, promulgating rules, and enforcing them. The program's formation is contingent on compliance with the Federal Meat Inspection Act, Federal Poultry Products Inspection Act and the Federal Humane Methods of Slaughter Act.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The New Mexico Livestock Board will be required to work with the federal government to create the inspection program compliant with federal law. As written, if the Livestock Board is unable to obtain federal approval for a state inspection program then this statute will be moot.
