BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

SB47-630 appropriates \$30,000,000 (GF, non-reverting) for FY2025 and subsequent fiscal years to the New Mexico State Department of Health (DOH) in support of recruitment and retention of New Mexico's rural health workforce.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The appropriation is directed to DOH, and consequently SB47-630 does not have a direct Fiscal Impact on the Health Care Authority (HCA). Nonetheless, there may be potential indirect fiscal impacts to the extent the GF appropriation is used in collaboration with HCA in support of joint federal-state funded initiatives.

Additionally, increased provider numbers and access will likely result in increased expenditures for Medicaid paid services.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

New Mexico has a shortage of health care professionals. Any recruitment efforts to hire and retain health care professionals will increase services to Medicaid clients.
