BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Creating the Anti-Hazing Act; requiring a code of conduct and hazing prevention committee at a public or private post-secondary educational institution; requiring an annual report; requiring hazing prevention education; providing penalty.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

NMIMT's position on hazing is consistent with the state's prohibition of hazing activities, which prohibits any form of hazing on or off campus.

The bill requires institutions to provide students with an educational program and post it on the institution's public website. The bill also requires institutions to establish a hazing prevention committee, maintain and publicly report actual violations' findings, and provide employees with hazing prevention education. To meet the above requirements, staff time is required to implement programs, provide training, develop and maintain reporting systems and websites, and coordinate with appropriate state agencies and local law enforcement. Annual costs are expected to be approximately \$50 thousand, including \$35 thousand in staff costs (part-time salaries plus 35% fringe benefits) and \$15 thousand in software, supplies, and other general operating costs to maintain required educational and training programs.
