BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: SB 61 amends Section 13-1-154.1 of the Procurement Code to limits related to procurement by state agencies and local public bodies as follows:

- 1. For contracts for architectural or engineering services, SB 61 raises the total amount of multiple contracts from \$7.5 million to \$15 million and the total amount for a single contract from \$650,000 to \$2 million;
- 2. For multiple indefinite quantity contracts pursuant to a price agreement, SB 61 raises the total amount from \$12.5 million to \$30 million, and the total amount for any one contract from \$4 million to \$10 million; and
- 3. For contracts authorized under Section 13-1-154.1 to any one firm, SB 61 raises the maximum aggregate contract amount from \$7.5 million to \$15 million for any four-year architectural or engineering services contract; and from \$12.5 million to \$30 million for any three-year construction contract.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB 61 raises several contract limits under Section 13-1-154.1. These contract limit increases are not likely to increase the Commission's administrative, advisory or enforcement work with respect to the Procurement Code.
