BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: SB 66 would amend existing NMSA 1978 Section 30-20-16 to add the crime of "swatting" – or knowingly making a false report with intent to cause an immediate emergency response – a fourth degree felony offense. The proposal would add a definition of swatting, as well as definitions for "public safety agency" and "public safety answering point." A person convicted of swatting could be order by a court to reimburse the victim for the economic harm of the person's unlawful actions, including wages lost and overhead costs for shutting down.

In addition, SB 66 would elevate the penalty for making a shooting threat from a misdemeanor to a fourth degree felony.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

As it reads now, the definition of swatting could be misinterpreted to mean that the report is regarding a "an ongoing emergency or threat of violence to a public safety agency or agency personnel or to a public safety answering point". Essentially, that the threat of violence is being made towards the public safety agency rather than that the individual is making a report to the public safety agency regarding an ongoing emergency or threat of violence.
