BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Amending the Graduate Scholarship Act, changing eligibility, limiting eligible fields of study, increasing awards, and making an appropriation. Eligibility includes the following:

- 1. New Mexico resident;
- 2. Study in a master's or doctoral degree;
- 3. Has earned a bachelor's degree and maintained a GPA of 3.0 or higher or a TA or RA;
- 4. Enrolled in at least six credit hours in a graduate field of study;
- 5. Agrees to serve during the academic year in an internship or assistantship;
- 6. First-year eligibility priority to women, minorities, persons with a visual impairment or other physical disability;
- 7. Amount of scholarships shall not exceed 100% of tuition and fees for the graduate program for the academic year.

Provide a \$5 million appropriation from the general fund for expenditure in FY25. The effective date is July 1, 2024.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The institution does not expect the bill to have any direct immediate financial impact on it, but will need to monitor the long-term effects. However, there may be a financial impact on students due to changes in requirements, such as changing eligibility from a U.S. citizen or permanent resident to a New Mexico resident. If a student temporarily moves to another state, they may temporarily lose their New Mexico residency, and thus, they may no longer be eligible for this scholarship. On the other hand, the scholarship amount is to be increased from \$7,200 per year to the new requirement of not exceeding 100% of the tuition and fees for the enrolled academic year, which may benefit students and alleviate their financial burden to a certain extent.
