BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis</u>: Appropriates one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) from the general fund to the board of regents of New Mexico State University for expenditure in fiscal years 2025 and 2026 for a windmill technician certification workshop. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2026 shall revert to the general fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

This funding will benefit the Cooperative Extension Service's and Department of Agricultural and Extension Education's efforts in the College of ACES to serve New Mexicans. The NMSU Windmill Technology Certification Workshop offers training on conventional windmill designs and applications; windmill safety; selection, siting and set up; mill restoration; maintenance and repair; and wellhead and groundwater protection. The comprehensive training workshop in traditional windmill water lifting applications is conducted by several of the industry's leading experts, with classroom, shop laboratory, and field demonstration instructional settings. The workshop includes ranchers, professional millers, tribal range managers, and traditional college students. Significant equipment upgrades are needed to support current needs of the equipment used to support the NMSU Windmill Technology Certification Workshop. Funding through this appropriation will allow critical equipment updates to the workshop and program.
