#### **BILL SUMMARY**

<u>Synopsis:</u> SB96 seeks to increase the penalty for attempted murder and second degree felony resulting in the death of a human being. Section 1 of the proposed legislation adds specific language to 30-28-1 Attempt To Commit A Felony specifying that attempted second degree murder is guilty of a third degree felony with a basic sentence of nine years. Section 2 of the proposed legislation increases the sentence for a second degree felony resulting in the death of a human being from 15 to 18 years of imprisonment.
