BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Transportation Department shall administer disadvantaged business enterprise program provided by federal law and shall expend no less than thirty percent of federally assisted contract funds eligible for disadvantaged businesses

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Federally assisted contract in which thirty percent assisted contract funds are eligible for the disadvantaged business. Appropriation in the agency would be impacted for seventy percent of allocated state budget with thirty percent of federal funds of contract funds.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The contractor must provide information related to being qualified under a federally assisted disadvantaged business. Agencies would need to follow the Procurement Code for any issued contract with a disadvantage preference. Currently, there is no definition of a disadvantaged business enterprise or preference within the New Mexico Procurement Code. §13-1-30(B) states that if there an agency must comply with "mandatory applicable federal law and regulations." If the agency's federal funding required application of federal programs, such as disadvantaged businesses, et. al., the agency would need to comply with that requirement. In doing so, it would still be in compliance with the Procurement Code.

Transportation would be required to procure services through an RFP or an ITB with a disadvantaged preference. Currently disadvantaged preference is not included in the NM Procurement Code.
