SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Senate Bill 138 (SB 138) appropriates \$10 million to the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) to provide grants to counties and municipalities for them to demolish condemned residential properties. These grants will be awarded and administered in accordance with a newly created set of rules, developed by DFA, that promulgate the rules for the administration of and applications for these funds by December 1, 2024.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB138 appropriates \$10 million from the general fund for expenditure in FY 2025 and subsequent years thereafter. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

DFA contains the experience to promulgate rules and procedures for distributing funds to counties and municipalities. This experience is seen in the department's ability to make emergency rental assistance awards to individuals, counties, and municipalities. Once awards have been identified, the Local Government Division (LGD) will enter into grant agreements to obligate funds and issue payment reimbursements for valid expenditures. The LGD would be tasked with ensuring the legal requirements of the grant agreement are met and that the funding is monitored throughout its life cycle.
