BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Original: Senate Bill ("SB") 204 proposes to create a new section of law prohibiting the carrying of firearms in parks and playgrounds within New Mexico except by peace officers, certain security officers, and members of the military in performance of their official duties. A

violation of the prohibition would be a fourth-degree felony.

"Park" is defined as a public outdoor recreation area owned or managed by a municipality or county, and includes any adjoining parking lot but excludes outdoor shooting ranges.

"Playground" is defined as a public outdoor facility owned or managed by a municipality or county that has slides, swings, climbing structures, or other play equipment intended for use by children, and includes the facility's parking lot.

SB 204 does not indicate an effective date.

Amendment as of Feb. 10, 2024: SB 204a adds concealed carry licensees and federal firearms licensees to the categories of persons permitted to carry firearms in parks and on playgrounds.
