BILL SUMMARY

<u>Synopsis:</u> Revises Uniform Unclaimed Property Act. Specifically for child support, the removal of "but excludes child, spousal or medical support received by the child support enforcement division of the human services department, the New Mexico IV-D agency" from the Definitions will allow CSSD to pursue unclaimed property to settle a child support debt.

The Bill will also allow CSSD to subject a claim to property held under the Unclaimed Property Act for the payment of an enforceable child support debt.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Child support will now be able to release some of its undistributed collections as unclaimed property, which was previously excluded. Child Support now has the ability to stake a claim of unclaimed property for the payment of an enforceable child support debt the owner owes in this state for child support arrearages, including child support collection costs and child support arrearages that are combined with maintenance.

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

CSSD will be able to release some of its undistributed collections to the state's Unclaimed Property fund.

CSSD may also see an increase in collections by being able to claim property held under the Unclaimed Property Act for the payment of an enforceable child support debt.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

SB237 does not outline any requirements that dictate technical changes for the Child Support Enforcement System (CSES). If an interface is required for CSES to exchange data with another system, then detailed requirement would need to be gathered in order to determine the level of effort, time, and potential cost to complete. Given the effective date of January 2026, there is likely time to perform additional discovery related to possible IT impact.
