BILL SUMMARY

SB263 appropriates five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) from the General Fund to the Board of Regents of New Mexico State University (NMSU) for expenditure in FY25 and subsequent fiscal years for hiring a sports nutritionist to consult with the university's women's sports teams.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

SB263 appropriates five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) from the General Fund to the Board of Regents of New Mexico State University (NMSU) for expenditure in FY25 and subsequent fiscal years for hiring a sports nutritionist to consult with the university's women's sports teams. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the General Fund.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

SB263 appropriates five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) from the General Fund to the Board of Regents of New Mexico State University (NMSU) for expenditure in FY25 and subsequent fiscal years for hiring a sports nutritionist to consult with the university's women's sports teams.

The NMSU Athletics staff directory does not currently show any nutritionists on staff for men's or women's sports. A dietician is on staff with no specific assignment to men's or women's sports.

NMSU's closest peer in terms of athletics among New Mexico's higher education institutions (HEIs) is the University of New Mexico (UNM), as both institutions compete in the National Collegiate Athletic Association's (NCAA) Division I. The UNM Athletics staff directory does not list a nutritionist or a dietician on staff. However, UNM Athletics webpages do exist that show a sports dietician and a director of nutrition. It is possible these webpages are out of date.

NMSU currently competes in nine women's sports: basketball, cross country, golf, soccer, softball, swimming and diving, tennis, track and field, and volleyball.

AS NMSU does not appear to have a nutritionist on staff for men's or women's sports, in order to meet Title IX requirements on equal access to resources, any staff hired specifically for sports for one gender would need to have an equal staff position for the other. Alternatively, a nutritionist or a nutrition team could serve athletic teams for both genders.

NMSU did not submit this request to the NMHED for possible incorporation into the NMHED higher education comprehensive funding recommendation. The NMHED has a formal process for reviewing earmarked budget requests for higher education institutions when developing the NMHED funding recommendation.

The NMHED submitted its higher education funding recommendation to the Department of Finance and Administration (DFA) and the Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) on November 1 as is required by statute. (9-25-9 NMSA 1978)

PERFORMANCE IMPLICATIONS

There are no performance implications associated with SB263. If enacted, New Mexico State University (NMSU) could partner with the New Mexico Higher Education Department (NMHED) to create performance parameters for these funds.

ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS

New Mexico State University (NMSU) would administer these funds.
