BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: Senate Bill 61 increases the dollar limit for which a state agency or local public body can procure multiple architectural or engineering services contracts, and for multiple indefinite quantity construction contracts. The amendment to Senate Bill 61 further provides for adjustment of the limits on these contracts annually in accordance with the consumer price index.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

As with the original bill, while the amendments to SB 61 raise several contract limits under Section 13-1-154.1, these contract limit increases are not likely to increase the Commission's administrative, advisory or enforcement work with respect to the Procurement Code.
