SECTION III: NARRATIVE

BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis: The Senate Health and Public Affairs Committee substitute for Senate Bill 204 expands the list of individuals who would not be subject to the new crime of unlawfully carrying a firearm in a park or playground to include a concealed carry licensee and a federal firearms licensee.

Senate Bill 204 does not contain an effective date and would be effective on May 15, 2024, 90 days following adjournment of the Legislature, if signed into law.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

There will be a minimal administrative cost for statewide update, distribution and documentation of statutory changes. Any additional fiscal impact on the judiciary would be proportional to the enforcement of this law and commenced prosecutions. New laws, amendments to existing laws and new hearings have the potential to increase caseloads in the courts, thus requiring additional resources to handle the increase.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The expanded list of exempted individuals that would not be subject to the provision of this legislation seems appropriate since both concealed carry and federal firearm licensees are both subject to additional requirements as part of the licensing process.
