BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Senate Joint Resolution 2 ("SJR2") proposes to add language to Article XII, Section 13 of the State of New Mexico Constitution to provide for a nominating committee for all appointed non-student members of board of regents of state educational institutions from "a list provided by a nominating committee established by law." The nominating committee is to provide lists of names for appointments for members of the board of regents to the Governor. These appointments would apply to each board of regents of the state educational institutions enumerated in Article XII, Section 11 of the State of New Mexico Constitution.

The Legislature is to determine the appointment, terms, power, and duties of the nominating committee. However, no more than 50 percent of the nominating committee shall be members of the same political party.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None to this office.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

If approved, the proposed constitutional amendment must be submitted to the voters at the next regular election or at a special election to be held not less than six months after the adjournment of the legislature. An amendment that is ratified by a majority of the electors voting on the amendment shall become part of the constitution. N.M. Const. Art. XIX, §1.

An issue may arise when there is a vacancy in the nominating committee. The Amendment requires no more than 50% of the committee shall be members of the same political party. There is a concern that if one member of the nominating committee resigns, the committee would be out of compliance with the constitution until another member is appointed.
