12	CONVENE A SERIES OF MEETINGS WITH STAKEHOLDERS ALONG THE
13	STATE'S BORDER WITH MEXICO TO STUDY THE BORDER DEVELOPMENT ACT
14	AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR LEGISLATION THAT UPDATES THE
15	BORDER DEVELOPMENT ACT TO INCREASE TRANSPARENCY AND OVERSIGHT.
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17	WHEREAS, the Border Development Act was enacted in 1991,
18	establishing the border authority to "encourage and foster
19	development of the state, its cities and counties by developing
20	port facilities at international ports of entry"; and
21	WHEREAS, the Border Development Act has not been amended
22	since 2011; and
23	WHEREAS, since then, the United States economy has
24	experienced development due to geopolitical shifts, global
25	supply chain resets, climate change and a rapidly emerging
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1	electric vehicle industry; and
2	WHEREAS, the border authority is currently
3	administratively attached to the economic development
4	department; and
5	WHEREAS, the Border Development Act does not specify
6	professional requirements for border authority membership,
7	which may result in limited knowledge and skill sets in this
8	niche area of government; and
9	WHEREAS, the composition of the border authority should be
10	amended to be more inclusive of both the executive and
11	legislative branches; and
12	WHEREAS, the border authority only reports to the New
13	Mexico finance authority oversight committee regarding general
14	border activities and annual budget requests; and
15	WHEREAS, it would be beneficial for the border authority
16	to report to other committees, such as the legislative finance
17	committee; and
18	WHEREAS, reporting requirements for state agencies provide
19	oversight and transparency to the legislature and the public;
20	and
21	WHEREAS, the border authority is not authorized by statute
22	to promulgate rules; and
23	WHEREAS, the Border Development Act should be amended to
24	address these issues and to reflect the current needs of the
25	border authority;

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1 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF 2 REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the south central council of governments be requested to convene a series 3 4 of meetings with state and local stakeholders along the state's 5 border with Mexico to study the Border Development Act and make recommendations for legislation that updates the Border 6 7 Development Act to increase transparency and accountability and to inform the state of the value of the border authority in 8 9 overseeing economic and other growth along the border; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that input received from the stakeholders during the study inform the proposed legislation; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study review the current composition of the members of the border authority to consider including members from the legislature who will work with the governor's appointees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this proposed legislation be presented to the appropriate interim committees dealing with economic development and infrastructure during the 2024 interim; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to the executive director of the south central council of governments.

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
