AN ACT

MAKING GENERAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE OPERATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Department of Transportation Appropriation Act of 2024".

- SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Department of Transportation Appropriation Act of 2024:
- A. "federal funds" means any payment by the United States government to state government or state agencies, except those payments made in accordance with the federal Mineral Leasing Act and the federal State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, as amended;
- B. "general fund" means that fund created by Section 6-4-2 NMSA 1978 and includes the federal Mineral Leasing Act receipts; and
 - C. "other state funds" means:
- (1) unexpended, nonreverting balances in state agency accounts, other than internal service funds accounts, appropriated by the Department of Transportation Appropriation Act of 2024;
 - (2) all revenue available to agencies from sources other than the general fund, internal

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General State Funds/Inter-Federal Total/Target Fund Funds Agency Trnsf Funds Item service funds, interagency transfers and federal funds; and (3) all revenue the use of which is restricted by statute or agreement. SECTION 3. FORMAT.--The general format of the appropriations set forth in the Department of Transportation Appropriation Act of 2024 with respect to symbols used, column headings and stating of amounts is that used in the General Appropriation Act of 2023. SECTION 4. FISCAL YEAR 2025 APPROPRIATIONS AND PERFORMANCE STANDARDS.--DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION: (1) Project design and construction: The purpose of the project design and construction program is to provide improvements and additions to the state's highway infrastructure to serve the interest of the general public. These improvements include those activities directly related to highway planning, design and construction necessary for a complete system of highways in the state.
