AN ACT

RELATING TO GOVERNMENT CONDUCT; DECLARING THE PUBLIC POLICY OF  
THE STATE REGARDING CONDUCT OF CURRENT AND FORMER LEGISLATORS  
AND PUBLIC OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES; CLARIFYING AND CODIFYING  
PROVISIONS OF THE GOVERNMENTAL CONDUCT ACT; PRESCRIBING AND  
INCREASING PENALTIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 10-16-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1967,  
Chapter 306, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

"10-16-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Governmental  
Conduct Act:

A. "business" means a corporation, partnership,  
sole proprietorship, firm, organization or individual carrying  
on a business;

B. "confidential information" means information

1 that by law or practice is not available to the public;

2 C. "contract" means an agreement or transaction  
3 having a value of more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000) with  
4 a state or local government agency for:

5 (1) the rendition of services, including  
6 professional services;

7 (2) the furnishing of any material, supplies  
8 or equipment;

9 (3) the construction, alteration or repair of  
10 any public building or public work;

11 (4) the acquisition, sale or lease of any land  
12 or building;

13 (5) a licensing arrangement;

14 (6) a loan or loan guarantee; or

15 (7) the purchase of financial securities or  
16 instruments;

17 D. "employment" means rendering of services for  
18 compensation in the form of salary as an employee;

19 E. "family" means an individual's spouse, parents,  
20 children or siblings, by consanguinity or affinity;

21 F. "financial interest" means an interest held by  
22 an individual or the individual's family that is:

23 (1) an ownership interest in business or  
24 property; or

25 (2) any employment or prospective employment

5 H. "official act" means an official decision,

9 toward the success or failure of a political party, candidate  
10 for partisan political office or partisan political group;

11 ~~[F.]~~ J. "public officer or employee" means any  
12 elected or appointed official or employee of a state agency or  
13 local government agency who receives compensation in the form  
14 of salary or is eligible for per diem or mileage but excludes  
15 legislators;

16 ~~[J.]~~ K. "standards" means the conduct required by  
17 the Governmental Conduct Act;

18 ~~[K.]~~ L. "state agency" means any branch, agency,  
19 instrumentality or institution of the state; and

20 ~~[L.]~~ M. "substantial interest" means an ownership  
21 interest that is greater than twenty percent."

23 Chapter 46, Section 28, as amended) is repealed and a new

1 PUBLIC POLICY.--Recognizing that a government position is a  
2 public trust, it is the public policy of the state and the  
3 intent of the legislature in enacting the Governmental Conduct  
4 Act that the powers and resources of state and local public  
5 office should only be used to advance the public interest and  
6 not to obtain personal benefits or to pursue private  
7 interests."

8 SECTION 3. Section 10-16-3.1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2007,  
9 Chapter 362, Section 9, as amended) is amended to read:

10 "10-16-3.1. PROHIBITED POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.--A public  
11 officer or employee is prohibited from:

12 A. directly or indirectly coercing or attempting to  
13 coerce another public officer or employee to pay, lend or  
14 contribute anything of value to a party, committee,  
15 organization [~~agency~~] or other person for a political purpose;

16 B. threatening to deny a promotion or pay increase  
17 to [~~an~~] a public employee who does or does not vote for certain  
18 candidates, requiring [~~an~~] a public employee to contribute a  
19 percentage of the public employee's pay to a political fund,  
20 influencing a subordinate public employee to purchase a ticket  
21 to a political fundraising dinner or similar event, advising  
22 [~~an~~] a public employee to take part in political activity or  
23 similar activities; or

24 [~~C. violating the officer's or employee's duty not~~  
25 ~~to use property belonging to a state agency or local government~~

3 (1) while the public officer or employee is on  
4 duty;

5 (2) in any room or building reserved for the

8 insignia identifying the office or position of the public  
9 officer or employee; or

10 (4) while using a vehicle owned or leased by a  
11 state agency or local government agency; provided, however,  
12 that this subsection does not apply to the governor, the  
13 attorney general or any other elected state official for whom  
14 state law enforcement officers provide security."

15 SECTION 4. A new section of the Governmental Conduct Act,  
16 Section 10-16-3.2 NMSA 1978, is enacted to read:

17 "10-16-3.2. [NEW MATERIAL] ABUSE OF OFFICE--PROHIBITING  
18 QUID PRO QUO CORRUPTION--PENALTY.--

19 A. A legislator or public officer or employee, with  
20 the purpose of benefiting the person's own or another's  
21 monetary interest or other financial interest, shall not:

22 (1) use the power or resources of the  
23 legislator's or public officer's or employee's office; or

24 (2) omit to perform a duty imposed by virtue  
25 of the public office.

1           B. A legislator or public officer during the term  
2 for which elected or appointed and a public employee during the  
3 period of employment shall not acquire a financial interest  
4 when the legislator or public officer or employee believes or  
5 should have reason to believe that the new financial interest  
6 will be directly affected by the legislator's or public  
7 officer's or employee's official act.

8           C. A legislator or public officer or employee shall  
9 not use:

10                   (1) property belonging to a state agency or  
11 local government agency or allow its use for an unauthorized  
12 purpose; or

13                   (2) the power of the public office to  
14 knowingly violate a law of the state.

15           D. A legislator or public officer or employee shall  
16 not request or receive, and a person shall not offer, any money  
17 or thing of value or promise of money or thing of value that is  
18 conditioned on or given in exchange for promised performance of  
19 an official act. A person who knowingly and willfully violates  
20 the provisions of this subsection is guilty of a fourth degree  
21 felony and shall be sentenced pursuant to Section 31-18-15 NMSA  
22 1978."

5 A. A state agency shall not enter into a contract  
6 with or take any action favorably affecting [~~any~~] a person or  
7 business that is:

8 (1) represented personally in the matter by a  
9 person who has been a public officer or employee of the state  
10 within the preceding year if the value of the contract or  
11 action is in excess of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) and the  
12 contract is a direct result of an official act by the public  
13 officer or employee; or

14 (2) assisted in the transaction by a former

25 remedies provided for in the Governmental Conduct Act."
