17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 34-1-9 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1993,
19	Chapter 278, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

21	A. Justices of the supreme court shall each receive
22	an annual salary [ <del>as provided by the legislature</del> ] <u>of two</u>
23	hundred thirty-two thousand six hundred dollars (\$232,600)
24	beginning July 1, 2024, and salaries thereafter shall increase
25	annually at the rate of inflation as measured by the consumer
