| 14 | OF COMMISSIONERS. |
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| 16 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: |
| 17 | SECTION 1. Section 17-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1921, |
| 18 | Chapter 35, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read: |
| 19 | "17-1-2. STATE GAME COMMISSIONAPPOINTMENTTERM |
| 20 | <u>A.</u> To carry out the purpose of Chapter 17 NMSA 1978 |
| 21 | and all other acts for like purpose, there is created a "state |
| 22 | game commission" of seven members. [not more than four of whom |
| 23 | shall be of the same political party at the time of their |
| 24 | appointment. The members of the commission shall be appointed |
| 25 | by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate. The |
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term of office for each member of the commission shall be four 1 2 years. At the time of making the first appointments, the governor shall designate the commissioners' terms as being one, 3 two, three or four years so that the term of no more than two 4 commissioners shall expire each year. 5 6 In making appointments to the state game commission, 7 one member shall be appointed from each of the following districts: 8 9 A. District one: Curry, De Baca, Roosevelt, 10 Chaves, Lincoln, Otero, Eddy and Lea counties; B. District two: Catron, Socorro, Grant, 11 12 Hidalgo, Luna, Sierra and Dona Ana counties; 13 C. District three: San Juan, McKinley, 14 Cibola, Valencia, Sandoval, Los Alamos and Rio Arriba counties; D. District four: Santa Fe, Taos, Colfax, 15 16 Union, Mora, Harding, Quay, San Miguel, Guadalupe and Torrance 17 counties; and 18 E. District five: Bernalillo county. 19 The remaining two members shall be appointed at-large. At 20 least one member of the commission shall manage and operate a 21 farm or ranch that contains at least two species of wildlife on 22 that part which is deeded land requiring licensing prior to 23 legal pursuit under the provisions of Section 17-3-2 NMSA 1978. 24 At least one member shall have a demonstrated history of 25 involvement in wildlife and habitat protection issues and whose .227445.1

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1 activities or occupation are not in conflict with wildlife and 2 habitat advocacy.] 3 B. Three members of the commission shall be appointed by the governor, positions one, two and three, with 4 5 no more than one residing in any one county and with no more 6 than two affiliated with the same political party. 7 C. Four members of the commission shall be New Mexico residents and shall be appointed by the New Mexico 8 9 legislative council, with no more than one residing in any one 10 county, as follows: 11 (1) position four, a rancher or farmer who 12 owns or manages a New Mexico ranch or farm, on which at least 13 two species of animals for which game hunting is licensed under 14 the provisions of Section 17-3-2 NMSA 1978 are frequently 15 present; 16 (2) position five, a conservationist who for 17 the previous four years has been an employee, member of the 18 board or member of an established advisory committee of a 19 nonprofit habitat or wildlife conservation organization the 20 primary focus of which is not game species; 21 (3) position six, a hunter or angler who has 22 held a New Mexico hunting or fishing license each of the 23 previous four years; and 24 (4) position seven, a scientist who holds at 25 least a master's degree from an accredited college or .227445.1 - 3 -

| 4 | D. No more than two of the commissioners appointed |
| 5 | by the New Mexico legislative council shall be affiliated with |
| 6 | the same political party. |
| 7 | E. All commissioners shall be appointed with the |
| 8 | advice and consent of the senate. Except as provided in |
| 9 | Section 2 of this 2024 act, the term of office for each member |
| 10 | of the commission shall be six years. |
| 11 | F. Commissioners shall serve for no more than two |
| 12 | terms after the effective date of this 2024 act. A partial |
| 13 | term shall be counted as one full term, unless the partial term |
| 14 | <u>is less than one full year.</u> |
| 15 | <u>G. When a commissioner dies, resigns or no longer</u> |
| 16 | meets the qualifications required for the commissioner's |
| 17 | original selection, or misses three consecutive meetings, that |
| 18 | position on the commission becomes vacant. The original |
| 19 | appointing authority for the vacant position shall appoint a |
| 20 | successor for the remainder of the term in the same manner as |
| 21 | the original selection for that position was made. |
| 22 | H. A commissioner shall not be removed except for |
| 23 | incompetence, neglect of duty or malfeasance in office; |
| 24 | provided, however, that no removal shall be made without notice |
| 25 | of hearing and an opportunity to be heard having first been |
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1 given to the commissioner. The supreme court is given 2 exclusive original jurisdiction over proceedings to remove commissioners under such rules as it may promulgate, and its 3 4 decision in connection with such matters shall be final. 5 The state game commission as provided in Chapter I. 6 17 NMSA 1978 shall have the same authority, powers and duties 7 as now vested in the state game commission by law [and each 8 member of the state game commission shall serve until his successor has been appointed and qualified]. 9 10 J. A person shall not be eligible to be appointed 11 as a commissioner if the person changed party affiliation 12 during the previous four years; provided that a person who 13 changed party affiliation for the purpose of voting in a 14 primary election pursuant to Section 1-4-5.7 NMSA 1978 and then 15 changed party affiliation back to the status of that person's 16 party affiliation immediately prior to the change within ninety 17 days shall not be considered to have changed party affiliation 18 for the purposes of this section. 19 K. The director of the New Mexico outdoor 20 recreation division of the economic development department or 21 the director's designee shall be an advisor to the commission." 22 TEMPORARY PROVISION--INITIAL APPOINTMENTS.--SECTION 2. 23 The initial appointments made to the state game commission by 24 the governor and the New Mexico legislative council pursuant to 25 the provisions of Section 1 of this act shall replace the

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1 members of the state game commission serving on the effective 2 date of this act, whose terms shall end on the effective date 3 of this act. Terms for the initial appointments to the 4 commission appointed on the effective date of this act shall be 5 as follows: for position one, a one-year term; 6 Α. 7 Β. for position two, a three-year term; 8 C. for position three, a five-year term; 9 D. for position four, a one-year term; 10 Ε. for position five, a three-year term; 11 F. for position six, a five-year term; and 12 G. for position seven, a five-year term. 13 SECTION 3.
