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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 21-1-27.2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
18	Chapter 367, Section 1) is amended to read:
19	"21-1-27.2. TECHNOLOGY ENHANCEMENT FUND CREATED
20	ALLOCATIONSAPPLICATION REVIEW PANELS
21	A. The "technology enhancement fund" is created in
22	the state treasury. The fund shall consist of appropriations,
23	income from investment of the fund, gifts, grants, donations
24	and bequests. Money in the fund shall not revert at the end of
25	any fiscal year. The fund shall be administered by the
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1 [commission on] higher education department. Money in the fund 2 shall be used to provide matching funds for federal or private 3 grants to [state research universities] research institutions 4 to support innovative applied research that advances knowledge 5 and creates new products and production processes in the fields 6 of agriculture, biotechnology, biomedicine energy, materials 7 science, microelectronics, water resources, aerospace, 8 telecommunications, manufacturing science and similar research 9 areas. Money from the fund shall be expended on warrants of 10 the secretary of finance and administration upon vouchers 11 signed by the [executive director of the commission on] 12 secretary of higher education or the [executive director's] 13 secretary's authorized representative.

B. Grants from the fund are available to [state research universities that are conducting collaborative research with corporate and nonprofit organizations] research institutions. A [state research university] research institution may apply for a grant from the fund in accordance with rules promulgated by the [commission on] higher education department. Allocations from the fund shall be based on a competitive process with applications reviewed by a panel of scientific and business experts established by the [commission] department. The review panel may determine new research areas and shall judge grant proposals based on excellence in research design and possible innovation [in] and an assessment of a .227089.3

7	C. To apply for a grant, [a state research
8	university] an applicant must have equal or greater matching
9	[funds] <u>money</u> for the proposal from sources other than the
10	state. <u>A grant from the technology enhancement fund shall not</u>
11	be used to supplant matching money that an applicant has
12	expended or encumbered for a previously received grant.
13	D. As used in this section, "research institution"
14	<u>means Navajo technical university, New Mexico state university,</u>
15	the New Mexico institute of mining and technology or the
16	university of New Mexico."
17	SECTION 2. APPROPRIATIONSeventy million dollars
18	(\$70,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the
19	technology enhancement fund for expenditure in fiscal year 2025
20	and subsequent fiscal years for the purposes of the fund. Any

unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of a fiscal year shall not revert to the general fund.

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
