12	DEFINITIONS IN THE LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP ACT;
13	CHANGING CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR ELIGIBILITY FOR THE
14	LEGISLATIVE LOTTERY TUITION SCHOLARSHIP; PROVIDING AN EXCEPTION
15	TO THE MINIMUM CREDIT-HOUR ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT IN THE
16	OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP ACT; EXEMPTING DUAL CREDIT CLASSES FROM
17	COUNTING TOWARD THE OPPORTUNITY SCHOLARSHIP CREDIT-HOUR CAP;
18	ALLOWING CREDIT FOR SUMMER SEMESTERS IN EACH SCHOLARSHIP.

21	SECTION 1. Section 21-21N-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2014,
22	Chapter 80, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:
23	"21-21N-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Legislative

10 secondary educational program in [the state] New Mexico or
11 received a high school equivalency credential while maintaining
12 residency in New Mexico and who:

 to read:

 "21-21N-3. TUITION SCHOLARSHIPS AUTHORIZED--QUALIFIED
 STUDENTS.-

A. To the extent that funds are made available by
the legislature from the fund, the boards of regents or
governing bodies of public post-secondary educational
institutions and tribal colleges shall award tuition
scholarships in department-approved amounts to qualified
students [and legacy students] attending their respective
public post-secondary educational institutions.

B. [Beginning in fiscal year 2015:

(1) a legacy student is eligible to receive a tuition scholarship until the total number of program semesters for which the legislative lottery scholarship is received pursuant to the former provisions of Sections 21-1-4.3, 21-13-10 and 21-16-10.1 NMSA 1978 or the Legislative Lottery Tuition Scholarship Act reaches eight; provided that the legacy student maintains residency in New Mexico, maintains a grade point average of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale and completes twelve or more credit hours per program semester; and

(2)] A qualified student [who is not a legacy student] is eligible to receive the tuition scholarship for a maximum of seven <u>fall and spring</u> program semesters and <u>a</u> .226574.7 - 5 -

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1 maximum of three summer semesters, or no more than three and 2 one-half years for a bachelor's degree, in an amount determined pursuant to the provisions of Section 21-21N-4 NMSA 1978. 3 4 С. Except as otherwise provided in this section, a 5 tuition scholarship may be awarded to a qualified student who: maintains residency in New Mexico; 6 (1)7 maintains a grade point average of 2.5 or (2) higher on a 4.0 scale; and 8 9 (3) completes: 10 (a) for a student attending a four-year 11 public post-secondary educational institution or a tribal 12 college, fifteen or more credit hours per fall and spring 13 program semester, and no fewer than three and no more than nine 14 credit hours for summer semesters; provided that a student is 15 not required to attend summer semesters to maintain 16 eligibility; and provided further that credit-hour limits do 17 not apply to the last semester before graduation; and 18 (b) for a student attending a two-year 19 public post-secondary educational institution, twelve or more 20 credit hours per fall and spring program semester, and no fewer 21 than three and no more than nine credit hours for summer 22 semesters; provided that a student is not required to attend 23 summer semesters to maintain eligibility; and provided further 24 that credit-hour limits do not apply to the last semester 25 before graduation. .226574.7

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1 D. For students with disabilities who may require 2 accommodations, the department, in consultation with the 3 student and the office at the public post-secondary educational 4 institution or the tribal college that serves students with 5 disabilities, shall review both the definition of "full time" and the maximum number of consecutive program semesters of 6 7 eligibility and adjust either or both as deemed reasonable and 8 appropriate, based on the student's disability needs. In no 9 case, however, shall "full time" mean fewer than six credit 10 hours per semester during the fall and spring semesters or 11 three credit hours per summer semester, if attending, and in no 12 case shall eligibility extend beyond fourteen consecutive 13 program semesters. The definition of "qualified student" 14 notwithstanding, a New Mexico resident who had to leave the 15 state to receive an education pursuant to the federal 16 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act shall be eligible 17 for a tuition scholarship if the student graduated from an 18 accredited high school in another state and otherwise meets the 19 qualifications for a tuition scholarship pursuant to the 20 definition of "qualified student" and this section."

SECTION 3. Section 21-21R-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022, Chapter 42, Section 2) is amended to read:

"21-21R-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Opportunity Scholarship Act:

A. "community college" means a branch community .226574.7

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college of a four-year state educational institution, a twoyear state educational institution or a community college or technical and vocational institute established pursuant to Chapter 21, Article 13 or 16 NMSA 1978;

5 B. "department" means the higher education6 department;

C. "eligible student" means a New Mexico resident
who is enrolled [or enrolling in at least six credit hours,
excluding the summer semester] in a public post-secondary
educational institution or tribal college at any time following
high school graduation or the award of a high school
equivalency credential in New Mexico and who meets other
conditions for eligibility;

D. "public post-secondary educational institution" means a four-year state educational institution or a community college;

E. "scholarship" means [an] <u>the</u> opportunity scholarship;

F. "state educational institution" means an institution of higher education enumerated in Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico; and

G. "tribal college" means a tribally, federally or congressionally chartered post-secondary educational institution located in New Mexico that is accredited by the higher learning commission."

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1	SECTION 4. Section 21-21R-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022,
2	Chapter 42, Section 3) is amended to read:
3	"21-21R-3. CONDITIONS FOR ELIGIBILITY
4	A. A scholarship may be awarded to an eligible
5	student who:
6	(1) has not earned a baccalaureate degree at
7	the time the scholarship is awarded;
8	(2) is enrolled in [a minimum of] <u>at least</u> six
9	credit hours per semester and no more than eighteen credit
10	hours per fall or spring semester; except that the credit-hour
11	limits do not apply to a student in the last semester before
12	graduation;
13	(3) is enrolled in at least three and no more
14	than nine credit hours per summer semester; provided that a
15	student is not required to attend a summer semester to maintain
16	<u>eligibility;</u>
17	[(3)] <u>(4)</u> maintains a cumulative grade point
18	average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale; and
19	[(4)] (5) has complied with other rules
20	promulgated by the department to carry out the provisions of
21	the Opportunity Scholarship Act.
22	B. A scholarship may be awarded for the summer
23	semester; provided that the student enrolls in [no less than]
24	at least three and no more than nine credit hours; and provided
25	further that the summer semester is not required to maintain
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eligibility; and provided further that credit-hour limits do not apply to a student in the last semester before graduation.

C. A scholarship may be awarded for one creditbearing certificate or certificates, only one associate degree and only one bachelor's degree per student.

D. A scholarship for a credit-bearing certificate may only be awarded where data indicates that the certificate is in high demand by New Mexico employers as determined by the department in consultation with the workforce solutions department.

E. Students with disabilities or exceptional mitigating circumstances may petition for a waiver of eligibility, <u>credit-hour limits or other</u> requirements on a per semester basis. The lead financial aid officer of the public post-secondary institution or tribal college shall exercise professional judgment in consideration of any request for a waiver."

SECTION 5. Section 21-21R-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022, Chapter 42, Section 4) is amended to read:

"21-21R-4. SCHOLARSHIP AUTHORIZED--ADMINISTRATION.--

A. The department shall administer the Opportunity Scholarship Act and shall promulgate rules to carry out the provisions of that act.

B. Scholarships shall be awarded to qualified eligible students in an amount not to exceed one hundred .226574.7 - 10 -

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1 percent of tuition and fees after all other state financial aid 2 has been applied. Qualifications shall be determined by rule 3 of the department. 4 Prior to June 1 of each year, based on the C. 5 amount appropriated by the legislature from the opportunity 6 scholarship fund and on the projected enrollment at all public 7 post-secondary educational institutions and tribal colleges, 8 the department shall: 9 (1)determine the total amount of money 10 available for all scholarships for eligible students; 11 (2) determine the award amount for public 12 post-secondary educational institutions and tribal colleges; 13 and 14 notify all public post-secondary (3) 15 educational institutions and tribal colleges of the 16 determinations made pursuant to Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this 17 subsection. 18 D. In determining distribution and award amounts 19 for the scholarships, the department shall: 20 distribute to all public post-secondary (1) 21 educational institutions and tribal colleges an amount not to 22 exceed the remaining balance in the opportunity scholarship 23 fund; and 24 (2) subject to the provisions of Paragraph (1) 25 of this subsection, distribute to each public post-secondary

4	E. Prior to June 1 of each year, the department
5	shall determine the maximum distribution to each public post-

9	SECTION 6. Section 21-21R-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2022,
10	Chapter 42, Section 5) is amended to read:
11	"21-21R-5. DURATION OF SCHOLARSHIP AUTHORIZED
12	A. Each scholarship is for a period of one
13	semester, including the summer semester. A scholarship may be
14	renewed [provided that] <u>if</u> the eligible student continues to
15	meet the conditions of eligibility.
16	B. Scholarships may be provided to an eligible
17	student until the eligible student receives a credit-bearing
18	certificate or certificates.
19	C. Scholarships may be provided to an eligible
20	student for up to ninety credit hours for the completion of
21	[an] <u>one</u> associate degree; <u>provided that dual credit courses</u>
22	that an eligible student previously completed shall not count
23	toward the credit-hour cap.
24	D. Scholarships may be provided to an eligible
25	student for up to one hundred sixty credit hours for the
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1	completion of [a] <u>one</u> bachelor's degree; <u>provided that dual</u>
2	credit courses that an eligible student previously completed
3	shall not count toward the credit-hour cap.
4	[E. Scholarships may be provided to an eligible
5	student until the eligible student graduates from a four-year
6	public post-secondary educational institution or tribal
7	college.]"
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
