12	SECTION 1. A new section of the Higher Education		
13	Department Act is enacted to read:		
14	"DEFINITIONSAs used in Sections 1 and 2 of this 2024

16	A. "participant" means a New Mexico resident		
17	approved by the department to participate in the pilot		
18	program;		
19	B. "pilot program" means the New Mexico workforce

**SECTION 2.** A new section of the Higher Education Department Act is enacted to read:

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"NEW MEXICO WORKFORCE TRAINING ECONOMIC SUPPORT PILOT PROGRAM--CREATED--ADMINISTRATION--ELIGIBILITY--MONETARY STIPEND--RULES.--

A. The "New Mexico workforce training economic
support pilot program" is created within the department as a
three-year study. The department may use money appropriated
to the department to pilot and evaluate the expansion of
integrated basic education and skills training programs. The
purpose of the pilot program is to:

15 (1)demonstrate that the state can measurably increase access to living wage jobs, thereby 16 meeting the state's needs for jobs in high-demand industries 17 and fields and reducing poverty, increasing financial 18 stability and lowering dependence on government services for 19 20 participants by providing ongoing economic support through monetary stipends during the period in which those 21 participants are enrolled in and attending certain 22 department-approved workforce training programs; 23

develop and implement eligibility

program. Criteria for consideration should include current income, education and employment status of applicants to the pilot program, and eligibility criteria shall not restrict participants based on immigration status;

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5 (3) develop and administer an economic 6 support program to provide participants with ongoing monetary 7 stipends to enable the participants to acquire training and 8 skills necessary to obtain employment, earn a living wage 9 and, in the process of acquiring that training, to prevent 10 income, housing and food insecurity. The stipends provided 11 pursuant to this paragraph should cover the costs associated with basic living needs, including housing, food and 12 transportation, and the costs associated with enrolling in 13 and attending a workforce training program; and 14

15 (4) identify and approve workforce training 16 programs in the following priority industries or fields: 17 (a) health care, including behavioral 18 health;

19	(b)	early childhood education or care;
20	(c)	natural resources management;
21	(d)	renewable energy;
22	(e)	broadband expansion;
23	(f)	first responders;
24	(g)	construction industries;
25	(h)	aerospace;

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1 (i) biosciences; 2 (j) cybersecurity; 3 (k) film and television; 4 outdoor recreation; (1)5 (m) sustainable agriculture; intelligent manufacturing; and 6 (n) 7 (0) global trade. 8 Β. The department shall develop, implement and 9 administer the pilot program created in Subsection A of this 10 section and may receive technical assistance from the health care authority department and may collaborate with other 11 state agencies, members of the business community, worker 12 organizations, including trade unions, appropriate nonprofit 13 organizations and community organizations, as deemed 14 15 appropriate. In developing the pilot program, the department shall: 16 determine eligibility requirements for 17 (1) applicants wishing to participate in the pilot program; 18 provided that eligibility shall require New Mexico residency 19 20 but shall not be restricted based on immigration status; (2) determine processes, procedures and 21 forms required for application to participate in the pilot 22 program; 23 determine processes and criteria for 24 (3) approval of workforce training programs and for ongoing 25

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2 no later than April 1, 2025, determine (4) 3 and recommend to the legislative finance committee 4 participant eligibility requirements and appropriate dollar 5 amounts for monetary stipends depending on factors, including 6 a participant's selected industry or field workforce training program, income and education levels and any other relevant 7 8 factors deemed appropriate by the department; provided that a 9 monetary stipend shall not exceed one thousand dollars 10 (\$1,000) per month for up to twelve months; 11 (5) no later than April 1, 2025, promulgate and adopt rules for the administration of the pilot program; 12 and 13 by December 1, 2025 and by December 1 of (6) 14 15 each subsequent calendar year, and in consultation with the health care authority department and any other appropriate 16 state agency, provide a report to the legislative finance 17 committee assessing the impact and outcomes of the pilot 18 program and providing department recommendations." 19 20 SECTION 3.
