## SUMMARY

### Synopsis of House Bill 308

House Bill 308 authorizes the issuance of general obligation bonds (GOB) totaling approximately \$289.6 million. The bill proposes four bond issues including capital expenditures for senior citizen facilities statewide (\$30.4 million); for library resource acquisitions (\$19 million); for higher education, special school, and tribal school capital improvements and acquisitions (\$229.6 million); and for a state agency (\$10 million). The bill contains an emergency clause and would become effective immediately upon the signature of the governor. *A listing of the projects contained in this bill is attached.*

## FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

According to revenue estimators, general obligation bond (GOB) capacity is \$289.6 million, which will keep the state's general obligation indebtedness below 1 percent of the assessed value of all property subject to taxation in the state, consistent with the requirements of the New Mexico Constitution. Authorizing no more than the stated capacity maintains a flat mill levy of 1.36. The authorization of \$289.6 million includes the cost of issuance, a nonrecurring expense to GOB capacity.

Issuance and sale of general obligation bonds requires approval by the electorate in the November 2024 general election. General obligation bonds are payable from a dedicated ad valorem (property) tax levied on all property subject to property taxation. The bonds are backed by the full faith and credit of the state. According to the Board of Finance, in the last fiscal year the state collected \$138.3 million in revenues dedicated to servicing general obligation bond indebtedness.

If ratified by the voters, general obligation bonds are approved for issuance by the State Board of Finance in spring of 2025 following the general election. The funds authorized in this bill will be available to the recipients in the spring of 2025.

The state agencies and higher education institutions to which money has been appropriated in this bill shall be responsible for monitoring the projects funded in the bill to ensure compliance with the laws and Constitution of New Mexico and shall cause to be reverted any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the earlier of the third full fiscal year after issuance of the bonds or the termination or completion of the specific project. Reverted funds shall be deposited in the debt service fund established by the state treasurer for the purpose of paying the principal and interest on the state's general obligation bonds.

## **SIGNIFICANT ISSUES**

The Aging and Long-Term Services Department (ALTSD) recommended capital outlay appropriations totaling \$30.4 million for 104 projects from senior centers statewide; all recommended projects are included in the bill. ALTSD, Area Agencies on Aging, and the Department of Finance and Administration rated projects statewide by applying criteria and allocating points to prioritize projects in five categories: code compliance, meals and other equipment, vehicles, construction and major additions, and for plan and design.

The New Mexico Library Association requested \$19 million on behalf of public libraries, public school libraries, academic libraries, and tribal public libraries. Public and tribal libraries will continue to allocate the funding based on county populations and library service areas, as required by regulation. The Department of Cultural Affairs indicates 82 public libraries, and 21 tribal libraries will be eligible for the funding. Public school libraries distribute bond funds with a base grant to each public and charter school with an operating school library, with remaining funds distributed by per capita student count by building. About two-thirds of funding for New Mexico college and university libraries will be distributed based on full-time-equivalent student enrollment and the remaining one-third will be used to collaboratively purchase electronic resources (academic journals, electronic reference books, electronic books, and educational films) for all students regardless of institution or course work, particularly in rural areas.

Institutions of higher education, special schools, and tribal schools requested approximately \$700 million for capital needs statewide. Both the Higher Education Department and the Legislature considered some of the requests for general fund appropriations rather than general obligation bonds. The bill proposes approximately \$229.6 million for higher education, special schools, and tribal schools projects. The largest projects include \$52 million for a humanities and social science complex at the University of New Mexico (UNM), \$35 million for renovations and expansion to the College of Pharmacy at UNM Health Sciences Center, \$20 million for steam tunnel and electrical infrastructure upgrades at New Mexico State University (NMSU), \$15

million for improvements to NMSU agricultural experimentation centers, \$10 million for a new creative media facility at NMSU, \$10 million for a new makerspace facility at the Central New Mexico Community College, and \$9 million for an early childhood development center building at Western New Mexico University.

Additionally, \$10 million is appropriated to the Department of Information Technology for continued buildout of the P25 public safety radio communications system, which benefits communities and public safety agencies statewide.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE IMPLICATIONS**

The state agencies, state institutions, and tribal institutions to which bond proceeds are directed are responsible for monitoring the projects funded within the bill to ensure compliance with the New Mexico Constitution and laws. The oversight by the agencies includes all financial transactions and reporting.

## **OTHER SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES**

The Higher Education Department (HED) held hearings for capital outlay requests with all post-secondary education institutions, special schools, and tribal schools. The Higher Education Capital Committee consists of representatives of HED, Department of Finance and Administration, Energy Minerals and Natural Resources, and Legislative Finance Committee staff.

The proposed projects in the bill for consideration by the full Legislature are based on the following criteria:

- Student, faculty, and public safety;
- Project completion;
- Funding from other sources;
- Facility condition index;
- Instructional & General (I&G) and space utilization;
- Energy-efficiency standards;
- Full-time student enrollment trends;
- Programmatic use of building; and
- Project readiness.
