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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 22-23C-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2021,
18	Chapter 51, Section 5) is amended to read:
19	"22-23C-5. BLACK EDUCATION LIAISON CREATEDDUTIES
20	A. The "Black education liaison" is created in the
21	department.
22	B. The liaison shall:
23	(1) focus on issues related to Black education
24	and advise the secretary and the council on the development and
25	implementation of public policy regarding the education of
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1 Black students;

2 (2) advise the department and the council on
3 the development and implementation of the five-year strategic
4 plan for public elementary and secondary education in the state
5 as the plan relates to [Black student] the education of Black
6 students;

7 (3) assist and be assisted by other staff in
8 the department and in the higher education department to
9 improve elementary, secondary and post-secondary educational
10 outcomes for Black students;

11 (4) maintain and update information on the 12 department's website or a separate website that includes: 13 subject to funding, links to a (a) 14 statewide [hotline] online reporting portal for reporting 15 [racially charged incidents] school-based incidents of racism 16 or racial discrimination against anyone. A submission and any 17 information in connection to the submission made through the 18 online portal is not a public record and is exempt from the 19 Inspection of Public Records Act;

(b) links to the department's Black education [white] policy briefs or position papers as well as other pertinent research; and

(c) information on and links to historically Black colleges and universities;

(5) serve as a resource to enable school
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1	districts and charter schools to provide equitable and
2	culturally relevant learning environments, educational
3	opportunities and culturally relevant instructional materials
4	for Black students enrolled in public schools;
5	(6) support and consult with the council;
6	(7) support school districts and charter
7	schools to recruit parents on site-based and school district
8	committees that represent the ethnic diversity of the
9	community; and
10	(8) implement activities that are recommended
11	and prioritized by the council within available funding."
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
