The credited service of an adult correctional 12 officer member shall have actual credited service increased by 13 twenty percent for the purposes of state public safety member 14 coverage plan 1. 15 [G.] D. The credited service, accrued after July 1, 16 2021, of an adult probation and parole officer or a juvenile 17 probation and parole officer shall be increased by twenty 18 percent for the purposes of state public safety member coverage 19 plan 1. 20 [D.] E. The credited service, accrued after July 1, 21 2024, of a state fire member shall be increased by twenty 22 percent for the purposes of state public safety member coverage 23 plan 1. 24 [E.] F. The increase of twenty percent to accrued 25 credited service provided by Subsections C through E of this .230810.2

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section shall only apply to a state public safety member who was a retired member or a member on or before June 30, 2013.

 $[F_{\cdot}]$  <u>G.</u> Except as provided in Subsections B through [<u>E</u>] <u>F</u> of this section, the credited service of a member covered under state public safety member coverage plan 1 shall be credited as provided in Section 10-11-4 NMSA 1978.

[G.] H. State public safety member coverage plan 1 is applicable to adult probation and parole officer members and juvenile probation and parole officer members in the first full pay period after July 1, 2021 if the retirement board certifies to the secretary of state that, of those adult probation and parole officer members and juvenile probation and parole officer members to be covered under state public safety member coverage plan 1, a majority of the respective members voting have voted to approve adoption of that plan at an election conducted pursuant to Laws 2020, Chapter 11, Sections 63 through 66.

[H.] <u>I.</u> State public safety member coverage plan 1 is applicable in the first full pay period after July 1, 2024 for:

(1) state fire members who begin employment as a state fire member on or after July 1, 2024; and

(2) state fire members who were employed in a position and were subject to the definition of a "state fire member" prior to July 1, 2024, if the retirement board

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1 certifies to the secretary of state that, of those state fire 2 members to be covered under state public safety member coverage 3 plan 1, a majority of the respective members voting have voted 4 to approve the adoption of that plan at an election conducted 5 pursuant to [Section 8 of this 2024 act] Laws 2024, Chapter 52, 6 Section 8." 7 SECTION 2. AGE AND SERVICE REQUIREMENTS FOR NORMAL RETIREMENT.--Under state public safety member coverage plan 1:

A. for [<del>a</del>] <u>an adult correctional officer member, an</u> <u>adult probation and parole officer member, a juvenile probation</u> <u>and parolee officer member or a state fire</u> member who was a retired member or a member on June 30, 2013, the age and service requirements for normal retirement are:

(1) age sixty-five years or older and five or more years of credited service;

(2) age sixty-four years and eight or more
years of credited service;

(3) age sixty-three years and eleven or more years of credited service;

(4) age sixty-two years and fourteen or more years of credited service;

(5) age sixty-one years and seventeen or more.230810.2
