other physical disability and other groups that have 2 traditionally been underrepresented in the specific area of 3 graduate study or profession for which the scholarship is awarded." 4 5

SECTION 2. Section 21-21G-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, Chapter 111, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read:

"21-21G-5. CONDITIONS FOR FIRST-YEAR ELIGIBILITY.--

A. Priority shall be given to New Mexico students who are New Mexico residents with the greatest financial need and students who are residents from groups underrepresented in graduate education.

B. A scholarship may be awarded to a New Mexico 12 resident who has: 13

(1) earned a bachelor's degree and 14 15 maintained a grade point average of 3.0 or higher on a 4.0 scale or who holds a paid position supporting faculty 16 teaching or research activities; 17

met the admission requirements, is (2) 18 accepted for enrollment and enrolls in at least six credit 19 20 hours in a graduate field of study; and

complied with all the rules adopted by (3) 21 the department for award of the scholarship and the 22 provisions regarding the administration of the graduate 23 scholarship program." 24

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SECTION 3. Section 21-21G-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, HB 89

1 Chapter 111, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read: 2 "21-21G-6. CONDITIONS FOR CONTINUING ELIGIBILITY.--3 A. Except as provided in Subsection B of this 4 section, a scholarship may be re-awarded to a student who: 5 (1) was an award recipient the previous 6 year; maintains a grade point average of 3.0 7 (2) 8 or higher on a 4.0 scale and remains in good academic 9 standing as determined by the eligible institution; and 10 (3) is enrolled in at least six credit hours in a graduate field of study. 11 B. A graduate scholarship may be granted until the 12 award recipient either receives a terminal degree or has 13 qualified and received eight semesters of scholarship, 14 15 whichever occurs first." SECTION 4. Section 21-21G-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1988, 16 Chapter 111, Section 7, as amended) is amended to read: 17 "21-21G-7. AMOUNT OF SCHOLARSHIPS.--Scholarship award 18 amounts shall not exceed one hundred percent of tuition and 19 20 fees for the graduate program at the eligible institution for the academic year; provided that the department shall fund 21 only one semester at a time and shall not fund the second 22 semester of the academic year if the student does not enroll 23 for that semester or does not otherwise maintain 24 eligibility." 25

2	1988, Chapter 111, Section 10, as amended) is amended to

4	"21-21G-10. TERMINATION OF SCHOLARSHIPSA scholarship	
5	is terminated upon the occurrence of:	
6	A. withdrawal from the eligible institution by the	
7	award recipient or failure to reenroll for consecutive	
8	academic semesters;	
9	B. failure to maintain the required grade point	
10	average and other qualifications for the scholarship; or	
11	C. substantial noncompliance by the award
