8	SECTION 1. A new section of the Aging and Long-Term	
9	Services Department Act is enacted to read:

12	A. As used in this section:	
13	(1) "fictive kin" means a person not related

17	adoptive parent of a minor child's biological or adoptive	
18	parent and includes a person married to a grandparent;	
19	(3) "kinship caregiver" means a grandparent,	
20	next-of-kin or fictive kin who is raising and supporting a

22	(4) "next-of-kin" means a relative of a	
23	child, other than a parent or grandparent, who is raising and	
24	supporting a child;

1 for a child in this state who is a New Mexico resident and 2 who participates in the pilot program; (6) 3 "pilot program" means the kinship caregiver support pilot program; and 4 "program partner" means a community 5 (7) organization, nonprofit or area foundation in this state that 6 collaborates and partners with the department in the 7 8 administration of the pilot program. The "kinship caregiver support pilot program" Β. 9 is created within the department as a three-year pilot 10 program. The purpose of the pilot program is to: 11 develop and implement the pilot program (1) 12 within five to seven counties in the state and serve fifty 13 participants in each of the communities; and 14 improve the lives of children by (2) 15 referring participants to a program partner's monthly 16 economic support program and providing access to services or 17 referrals to help participants and the children cared for and 18 supported by those participants. 19 C. In establishing the pilot program provided in 20 this section, the department, in collaboration with the 21 program partners, shall: 22 (1) develop and implement processes and 23 eligibility criteria for kinship caregivers to apply to, and 24 become participants in, the pilot program. Criteria for 25

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1 consideration shall include a kinship caregiver's current 2 household income and the needs of the child or children that 3 are or will be cared for and supported by the kinship caregiver; 4 5 (2) determine and establish processes necessary to implement and administer the pilot program; 6 identify and coordinate access to (3) 7 8 federal, state and local programs and to services and referrals for participants, including legal representation, 9 public assistance and economic support services administered 10 by program partners; 11 (4) determine the requirements necessary to 12 use federal assistance or resources, including Title IV-E of 13 the federal Social Security Act funds, if available; 14 engage with other community (5) 15 organizations and nonprofit organizations and area 16 foundations to identify the availability for additional 17 resources and funds to provide economic support for 18 participants; 19 (6) develop and approve a budget for: 20 (a) salaries and benefits for staff to 21 assist participants in applying for participation in the 22 pilot program and in accessing additional services available 23 to participants; 24 legal assistance provided to (b) 25

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1	participants who may wish to attain legal custody or kinship	
2	guardianship of one or more children; and	
3	(c) other costs to the department	
4	necessary for the administration of the pilot program;	
5	(7) administer the pilot program and	
6	collaborate with, and receive technical assistance from,	
7	other state agencies, including the early childhood education	
8	and care department and any appropriate community or	
9	nonprofit organizations;	
10	(8) no later than June 1, 2025, promulgate	
11	and adopt rules for the administration of the pilot program;	
12	and	
13	(9) by December 1, 2025 and by December 1 of	
14	each subsequent calendar year, and in consultation with the	
15	early childhood education and care department and any other	
16	appropriate state agency, provide a report to the legislative	
17	finance committee assessing the impact and outcomes of the	
18	pilot program and providing department recommendations."
