educational institutions; the higher education department; the public education department; and state and local policymakers to work together to improve educational opportunities for Hispanic students for the purpose of increasing graduation rates, increasing post-secondary enrollment, retention and completion and ensuring lifelong success."

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SECTION 2. Section 22-23B-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 108, Section 5 and Laws 2010, Chapter 114, Section 5) is amended to read:

"22-23B-5. HISPANIC EDUCATION ADVISORY COUNCIL.--

The "Hispanic education advisory council" is 12 Α. created as an advisory council to the secretary. The council 13 shall advise the secretary on matters related to improving 14 15 public school education for Hispanic students, increasing parent involvement and community engagement in the education 16 of Hispanic students and increasing the number of Hispanic high school graduates who succeed in post-secondary academic, 18 professional or vocational education. 19

20 Β. The secretary shall appoint no more than twenty-three members to the council who are knowledgeable 21 about and interested in the education of Hispanic students, 22 including representatives of public schools; post-secondary 23 education and teacher preparation programs; parents; Hispanic 24 25 cultural, community and business organizations; other HB 487

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community and business organizations; and other interested
 persons. The secretary shall give due regard to geographic
 representation. Members shall serve at the pleasure of the
 secretary.

5 C. The council shall elect a chairperson and such6 other officers as it deems necessary.

7 D. The council shall meet as necessary, but at
8 least twice each year at the biannual Hispanic education
9 summit.

E. The council shall advise the secretary onmatters related to Hispanic education in New Mexico.

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F. Members of the council may receive per diem and mileage as provided for nonsalaried public officers in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance."
