BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Cited as the “Medical Injury Collaborative Resolution Act,” House Bill 15 provides a process for a patient and a health care provider to confer after an adverse health care outcome and potentially resolve a claim and enter a settlement without involving court action. It sets ground rules for “adverse outcome conferences,” including limits on how statements made in the conference may be used to prove fault or affect damages. The bill also requires certain disclosures when a health care provider requests a conference, including notice that participating does not extend the time to file a lawsuit
