BILL SUMMARY

Synopsis:

Section One of the Bill creates a new section of the Lobbyist Regulation Act (Act) requiring a lobbyist or their employer who is required to file an expenditure report or registration statement to also file a lobbying activity report with the Secretary of State filed within forty-eight hours after commencing lobbying activity detailing: 1) the specific legislation lobbied; 2) the lobbyist's and their employer's position on the legislation and whether it changed; and 3) the name of the lobbyist's employer that lobbied on the legislation (either directly or through the lobbyist). Section One additionally requires the lobbying activity report for each piece of legislation to be included or linked to the Legislature's website for that piece of legislation.

Section Two of the Bill amends NMSA 1978, Section 2-11-7 to add the new lobbying activity reports to the provision of the Act requiring that the Secretary of State publish reports filed by lobbyists under the Act.

Section Three of the Bill sets an effective date of January 1, 2027.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

A previous version of this bill introduced in 2025 as HB 143 included a provision requiring a new report each time a lobbyist's position changed. This bill does not include that provision, but this may leave some confusion. It is unlikely that a lobbyist would change their position within 48 hours of commencing lobbying, but unless a subsequent report is filed, disclosing the lobbying report on the legislation's web page would not capture this. As written, the bill does not clearly address how or if changes of position should be reported after the initial report.
